FALL 2006 INFORMAL RECRUITMENT RULES

1. The Rider University Fall Recruitment is a series of Continuous Open Bidding (COB) parties held by each chapter. The intent of Continuous Open Bidding is to provide maximum opportunities for membership to the greatest number possible.
2. The Panhellenic Council strongly recommends and urges each sorority to use good judgment, discretion, common sense, and maturity. Under all circumstances, promote recruiting the Greek system and not just the individual chapter.
3. No non-Greek women may enter any sorority residence until 8am on the first day of classes of the Fall semester – September 6, 2006
4. No non-Greek women may be in any sorority residence from 12 am until 8 am of any day until Saturday, October 7, 2006.
5. Until Saturday, October 7, 2006 no gifts of any kind are to be given to potential member unless the potential member partakes in an activity in which a gift is given. The activity must also include all sisters in attendance. Some examples are but not limited to Chinese Auctions, Arts & Crafts events, Raffle drawings, etc.
6. No non-Greek women may accompany any sorority member off campus for non-university reasons.
7. All potential members must have a 2.3 confirmed GPA, 2.5 for Alpha Xi Delta and Zeta Tau Alpha, and at least 12 completed credits. Before a bid is given to a potential member, the director of Greek Life must confirm all grades. The specific process will be determined at a meeting with chapter representatives prior to the start of the semester.
8. Any woman who pays chapter dues is considered active and will be counted in total. All chapters will submit a list of active sisters to the Director of Greek Life and to the Panhellenic President. No inactive members are allowed to participate in recruitment activities.
9. Alumnae are encouraged to attend recruitment events, but must have "Alumnae" written on their nametags in order to designate them from sisters who have not yet graduated. Members from other chapters must have their school's name on their nametags in order to designate them from sisters who attend Rider University. It is the Recruitment Chair's responsibility to inform these sisters of the recruitment rules and keep them enforced.
10. The Panhellenic Council strongly recommends chapters to encourage cultural diversity in the recruitment of its members.
11. The Panhellenic Council as stated in the Unanimous Agreements will enforce all guidelines, and the 1995 recruitment resolution adopted by the National Panhellenic Council.
12. Recruitment Infractions must be filed with the Panhellenic Council VP of Recruitment no later than 24 hours after the infraction is known, but no more than 10 days after it has occurred.
