#### - RIDER UNIVERSITY MOTTO -

This year has tested the ideal of Rider's motto, but our campus community has shown great resilience, swiftly switching to remote classwork, providing aid to students through emergency funds and the campus food pantry, and loaning laptops to students who do not have technology access. Our estimates are that at least \$1 million is needed to cover FY2021 expenses directly attributable to COVID-19 requirements that could not be funded from existing budgets, including:

- **6,000** masks for faculty and staff in direct contact with students
- **3,500** signs around campus for social distancing and CDC guidelines (this includes classrooms, dining areas and common areas)
- **2,000** masks for students
- **1,000**+ additional custodial hours for disinfection and sanitization of classrooms, labs and residence halls
- **500** bottles of hand sanitizer
- **350** new touchless paper towel dispensers
- **150** disinfectant wipe dispenser with stands in common areas and labs
- **150** protective table-top shields
- **100** additional hand sanitizer dispensers
- **100** additional antibacterial soap dispensers
- **6** tents for outdoor dining and hybrid classes
