First Semester

First and Second Semesters

I. Select a two-semester sequence of a Foreign Language. Placement by examination is required for students who wish to continue studying a language previously studied. Third Semester

III. Select one of the following courses: PHL 105 World Religions or PHL 106 Current Moral and Social Issues.
