Diversity Statements

I am the first member of my family to go to college and the first of a later legacy of Nurse Practitioners. I grew up in a lower middle-class family and experienced economic uncertainty, lacked modern technology. Coming from a small village in South India, the concept of routine healthcare access was foreign to me.

I came to the United States with a BSN from an institution that would seem substandard today compared to the new generation nursing programs. I started my career in the United States as a certified nurse assistant, then took the certifying exam to become a medication technician, and later a licensed practical nurse. After I passed the NCLEX and became eligible to practice as an RN, I devoted myself to becoming a mentor who would support nurses on a global scale. It was a joy to give my time, advice, and resources to nursing students, as well as help them acquire professional connections through my prior experience.

During my nursing career, I began to see people as a trifecta of body, mind, and soul, as opposed to viewing them as two-dimensional textbook cases. When I became a professor of nursing, I realized race and ethnicity were two powerful components of healthcare that resulted in bias and inequity.

The online classroom teaching experience I gained over the past 15 years taught me the challenges and opportunities of managing a multicultural classroom. I took the initiative to learn how to lead a diverse and equitable classroom. Respecting and appreciating an individual's abilities, experiences, and cultural values and norms is important and vital in academia. I learned to create a safe space to culturally diverse students, so that they can express their feelings, concerns, and perspectives without fear of judgment or reprimand.

As an online faculty, it was important to me that I was accessible to my students. Realizing that students had unique lifestyles, careers, and responsibilities outside of academics, I made myself available 24/7 via email or text messages, encouraging classroom participations by small group assignments. I also used prior feedback and commentary to guide me as I crafted syllabi for the next semesters. At the end I made sure to make the classroom topics fun, open, and relatable and tried my best to indicate to my students that I care for their learning and their well-being, both inside and out of my classroom. Understanding that my experience is different from that of my students, I believe is the key to excellent engagement and educational connections in the classroom. My commitment to promoting diversity in nursing programs and nursing workforce is grounded in my own personal experience, as I am from a diverse community myself. With each new class, I hope to learn from my students as much as they hopefully learn from me.

Today, I have built an academic and clinical career integrating my diverse experiences in practicing evidence-based clinical care, while also being involved in my communities. My ongoing commitment to teach virtually and encourage diversity and equity in academia is solid, as it is the source of my life, here in the US.
