

Five-Star Program: Following the full chapter assessment and review through the annual Standards and Expectations Accreditation Program, the Office of Student Involvement will combine all scores to give each chapter an overall rating based upon a Five-Star program. The Five-Star system will be used as a metric to distinguish Rider University Fraternities and Sororities and encourage chapters to go above the standard expectation.

Star scoring is as follows:

5 Star: Excellent, Distinguished Performance, Far Exceeds Expectations

4 Star: Goes Beyond Expectations, Very Good Performance **3 Star:** Standard Performance, Meets All/Most Expectations

2 Star: Does Not Meet All/Most Expectations, Needs Improvement, Probationary

1 Star: Poor Performance, Non-Compliant, Needs Significant Improvement, Probationary

5 Star	91 - 100
4 Star	84 - 90
3 Star	75 - 83
2 Star	65 - 74
1 Star	64 or below

To maintain good standing with the Office of Student Involvement all chapters are expected to score at a **3 Star or above**. Chapters who achieve at a **1 or 2 Star** level will be put on probationary status and will receive an action plan from the Office of Student Involvement. Chapters on probationary status for longer than two consecutive years are subject to a one-year suspension of all chapter activities.

The Five-Star system will also determine chapters' eligibility for Fraternity and Sorority Life Awards. For example, to be eligible for Chapter of the Year, a chapter must receive a minimum of 4 Star. Chapters that achieve 4 or 5 Star will be recognized at the ceremony and receive certificates to acknowledge their success.

Each year, the Five-Star results will be published by the time students return from winter recess. The results will be posted on the Fraternity and Sorority Life website and will be shared with chapter leadership, faculty/staff advisors, Alumni advisors, and Student Affairs Leadership.
