ACCOMMODATIONS FOR STUDENTS WITH A DISABILITY

- Who is eligible for accommodations and services?
 - Learning Disability
 - ADHD/ADD
 - Autism Spectrum Disorder
 - Traumatic Brain Injury/Concussion
 - Chronic Medical/Health Disability
 - Psychological/Psychiatric Disability
 - Orthopedic Disability
 - Blind or Low Vision
 - Deaf or Hard of Hearing

THE ACCOMMODATION PROCESS

- Complete the [Confidential Self-Disclosure Form](#)
- Provide documentation of disability (refer to the documentation guidelines on [SASS Web page](#))
- Meet with SASS professional for an intake interview
- Receive accommodation letters for the semester

ACADEMIC COACHING

- Academic Coaching may be for you if you struggle in any of these areas
 - Trouble with **time management** or **procrastination**
 - **Regularly avoiding work** when you get overwhelmed
 - **Anxiety or depression** which affects your ability to attend class or complete assignments
 - **Difficulty understanding complex material**
 - **Planning** schoolwork and setting priorities
 - **Difficulty staying focused**
