^U – Students have a number of options to satisfy this requirement; courses will be evaluated on an individual basis.

For transfer credit the Mercer student must have a grade of “C” or higher in all courses for transfer credit. (No transfer credit will be accepted for any course with a grade of “C-” or below.)

-The Rider English degree lists 3 concentrations: Literature Concentration, Writing Concentration, Cinema Studies Concentration.

-Honors Program in English: Student may apply in the senior year, must have a 3.25 cumulative GPA average and a 3.5 in English. Upon approval from the Department of English, a candidate enrolls in ENG-497-Advanced Study English, writes a thesis and submits it for department approval. The student must achieve a course grade of “B+” or better to graduate with honors in English.
