- g. Dean Johnson spoke as to the cost increasing significantly. The Lawrenceville SGA has financed this and allows for three rides per student.
- h. Senator Koblentz brought up a problem about the Printers. She will take this up with OIT
- i. Senator Callahan brought up a continuation of Senator Lakeland's idea for a student volunteer program to pick up students who needs rides off campus.
- j. Senator Kohler found that his constituents thought that SFB paying for instrument repair/additions was split between constituents.
- k. Senator Reed thought a trial mail room purchase service would be helpful
- l. Senator Sloan asked senators to poll constituents on how they wish to spend their bronc bucks? Could other services be paid by bronc bucks?
- m. Senator Garrick called for a constitutional amendment to set specific deadlines for spending on specific projects by SFB. After this deadline, all left over funding would go to instrument addition and repair.
- n. Senator Halbstein suggested instruments in need of dire repair should receive SFB funding, Other less important projects should be deferred. Halbstein isn't sure about the feasibility of a constitutional amendment.
